From the Revd. Ian Elliott

It would no doubt raise a few eyebrows among my friends, knowing my total lack of interest in the cooking *process* (as distinct from the *outcome*, of course!), to find me starting this piece with a reference to the Great British Bake Off. However, I recently read a comment which I found rang several bells in my mind – especially in the light of what Philip Rigby wrote in this column last month about the importance of treating other people with respect even when we hold strongly different opinions.

The writer observed, "Bake Off's sustained appeal is no surprise. When much of our news is a combination of confusing, depressing, and downright vitriolic, the opportunity to spend an hour soaking in the warm innocence of the Bake Off tent is a welcome escape. Though billed as a 'baking competition' there's something unusual about the way the bakers 'compete'. What takes place in the tent is more a working alongside than a working against.

"When bakers have a spare minute, they help other contestants out. When they're unsure how to proceed, they ask one another. When they struggle or are sent home, the overwhelming reaction of the others isn't relief or smugness, but compassion."

Knowingly or not, the contestants are expressing something of their true nature as created beings. The Bible declares that God made us for relationship – to express our human creativity

in partnership and mutual support rather than in competition and rivalry. At Christmas and throughout the year we celebrate a God who comes alongside us, to 'be there' for us in all the challenges life may throw at us. A God whose aim is not to put us down through constant criticism and judgement but to release the full potential which lies within us all as people made 'in his image'. A God who invites each of us to join with him in this enterprise in our everyday life and relationships.

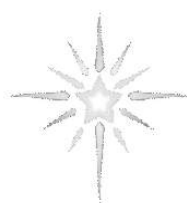
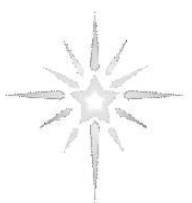
In competitive workplaces and in a deeply divided society, Bake Off reminds us that God's image in *every* human being gives infinite value and significance even to our fiercest 'rivals' and 'competitors'. It enables us to aspire to something better than a rat race of continually trying to push ourselves forward at the expense of other people. The "peace and goodwill" of which shepherds heard angels sing is not some sort of vague, impossible dream, but the reality of what life in this world is intended to be about. So the challenge to each of us is to respond to God's invitation to join with him in taking small, but nonetheless positive, steps towards this reality. It's something each one of us can do, both in the way we live among people we encounter day by day and in the way we think and speak about politicians and others who are so much in the public eye and whose words and decisions affect the lives of millions.

A VIEW FROM TEBAY

As the evenings draw in, winter seems to have come early which could be a depressing thought. However, despite the shorter days, I do not find it too bad as my main activity is now reading. It gives me more time to really get stuck into a variety of books and other publications such as 'The Reader' which arrives each month and 'The Economist', which is passed on to me from Jo. The Reader stimulates me in many ways even though I no longer have the privilege of conducting services. The Economist is sometimes a very depressing read as it outlines events in countries which have many more problems than we have. But the information it gives helps me to realise that, in spite of Brexit and the uselessness of many of our politicians, my life is relatively good.

Two celebratory events have happened recently: the Golden Wedding anniversary of Ian and Ronnie and the Silver Wedding anniversary of Steve and Jo. Both were joyous occasions. Especially the latter because Steve had somehow managed to keep it a secret from Jo and the look of delighted surprise on her face when she saw the assembled relatives and friends was wonderful to behold. In contrast however, two deaths have occurred which saddened me. Willie Law will be sadly missed by many people including those of us who meet every month at The Old School for a meal and a chat. Gordon Mason's funeral service at the chapel was well attended and the tributes from his family were both heartfelt and joyful.

Yesterday was Remembrance Sunday and over 50 people attended the service at which the royal British Legion standard was paraded, and a bugler played the appropriate tunes. It was, as always, a moving occasion. My father, who was in his 40s when I was born, served in France during WW1 and rarely spoke of his experiences. The only time I recall him doing so was when I was in my late 20s and told him where I was heading with a school party. When I said we were going to a seaside town called Wimereux, he said - very quietly - "I was in hospital for a bit there in 1916". He never mentioned his war service again and I - to my chagrin now - never asked him anything else about it.

The weather yesterday was brilliant - sunny and fairly warm - but today it is wet and cold. Perhaps today's conditions are more likely to persist than yesterday's - but I doubt we will experience the sort of flooding here that south Yorkshire has. I am happy enough so long as I can have a walk most days and get to church or chapel regularly -

even if it is wet. I still like going to Kendal when I can although the closure of Prelude, my regular eating place, has made Kendal less appealing.

I mentioned 'The Reader' earlier in this article and one item in the winter edition struck me as fascinating. 'Humour in the Bible' is not perhaps a subject many people will relate to but it is there more often than one might think - especially in The Old Testament. I will never be able to read or listen to Elijah and the priests of Baal again without smiling at the image of his taunting them. Nor will the tale of Jonah be the same as I visualise his physical appearance when vomited from the whale's stomach onto the shore. These are only two examples of humorous passages although not everybody will see them as such. Humour is an individual thing and my sense of it has always been somewhat quirky. I am glad to say, the Goon show was one of my favourite programmes and much modern 'comedy' leaves me cold.

I remember when I was teaching once asking a group of 15 year olds what was the most important attribute for a teacher to possess and one girl saying "a sense of humour, sir". That still remains with me in my mind because without that sense, life would be terrible!

MacMillan Coffee Afternoon.

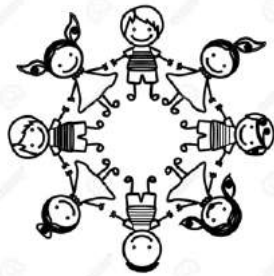
We held our coffee morning for MacMillan Cancer Support (part of the world's biggest coffee morning) on Friday 4th October, raising £108.46.

An Appeal from Ross Jenkin

You may know that I am a bit of a fell runner and over the

last few years I have been steadily improving and spending as much time as possible in the fells and next year I enter the most competitive field in fell running – Vet 40!

Last year I needed to take some time off work for depression and stress and found solace in the mountains. The mountains are my therapy, they are my church. I wanted to do something to help others who are suffering with mental health issues and decided to really challenge my physical strength and new-found mental strength by heading into the mountains of the home nations of Wales, Northern Ireland, Scotland and England to attempt something which has never been done before.

Each of the four home countries has a famous and extremely challenging mountain running "round", each of which only a few people have completed within 24 hours. My ambitious aim is to complete all four of these in one week - something which has never been done before!

I will start at daybreak on 21st June 2020 in Snowdonia with the aim of running the Paddy Buckley round (105km and approx 8500m of height gain) in 24hrs. I will then travel straight to the Mourne Mountains in Northern Ireland to run the Denis Rankin round (95km and 6500m of height gain) again in 24hrs. Next comes the Ben Nevis region of Scotland where I will run the Charlie Ramsey round (100km and 8200m of height gain) also in 24hrs, and then finally I will go back to my home - to the Lake District to complete the challenge with The Bob Graham round which is 104km with 8500m of height gain in 24hrs. This totals approximately 400km and 3.5 times the height of Everest from sea level in 6 days (including travel)!!

I have a target to raise £15,000 for charity through this challenge with a third going to Mind, a third to The Dogs Trust and a third to Mountain Rescue. I have already mentioned the significance of Mind for me, but the other charities have massive importance for me also. Our family dog, Luna, a collie- black lab mix, has been my fell running partner for many years but this ended in 2017 when she fell nearly 200 feet from Sharp Edge on Blencathra at the age of 12 years and nearly died. Thankfully she had no major injuries but was no longer able to run with me, so raising money for The Dogs Trust is important. The reasons to raise money for Mountain Rescue are fairly obvious for a mountain user – they are a voluntary organisation who go out in all weathers to rescue mountain users in many situations – need I say more?

I must make it clear that not one penny will be taken from donations to pay for my expenses of this trip which I hope will be covered by corporate sponsors or will come from my own pocket.

ORTON MANOR COURT

Abridged Minutes of Committee Meeting 4.11.19

1. **10 members were present;** there were two apologies.
2. **Minutes:** The Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 24th June 2019 had been circulated: agreed .
3. **Treasurer's report:** The Current Account £4,936.63, Deposit Account £8,753.46. There were no outstanding bills.
4. **Knott Lane:** The Chairman had met an official of Electricity North West about the suggested compound for equipment while work of diverting and burying the cables was proceeding, the area to be used as a car park afterwards, and this was agreed in principle. The boggy ground could be readily dealt with by excavation, matting and hardcore. This work would be carried out and paid for by ENW. The negotiations would be put in the hands of a Land Agent, whose fee would also be paid by ENW. Any fencing needed would be paid for by ENW. The work would be done in 2020 or 2021.
5. **Meldykes:** There had been no further progress; a meeting with the enhanced stewardship advisor is expected
6. **Footpath in front of West End houses:** It had been reported at the AGM that the concrete of this was disintegrating, and it was agreed that action should be taken. It would be inspected and recommendations made.
7. **Rent Increases:** these were discussed, but in the absence of our treasurer, no decision could be made.
8. **Any Other Business:**
 - a. OMC was asked if they could pay for compost for the planters in the square. Agreed.
 - b. The possibility of getting new members on to the Committee was discussed, as one member has left the area and another has not been able to attend for over a year through ill health.
9. **Dates of future Committee Meetings:** Mondays 3rd February, 27th April, 22nd June, 7th September (AGM) and 9th November 2020.
The meeting closed at 8.30 p.m.

Ash Dieback

Ash Dieback is a disease that has been affecting Ash trees in the UK for a number of years. Initially it was hoped that the disease could be contained but



sadly it now appears that this has not been possible and most of the Ash trees in the UK are likely to be affected. This constitutes around 12% of the UK's broadleaf trees so is likely to have a significant impact. Diseased trees quickly become brittle and are prone to casting limbs; this is a specific issue where trees are on a roadside or near public access land.

Professional advice should be sought for safety assessments and possible felling, specifically as any felling may require a licence from the Forestry Commission before it can go ahead (subject to volume). However, it should be noted that some Ash trees have shown resilience to the disease and these should be preserved so felling is not advised unless disease is present. Equally it may be possible to reduce the tree as oppose to felling it - a specialist tree surgeon will be best placed to advise on the best procedure.

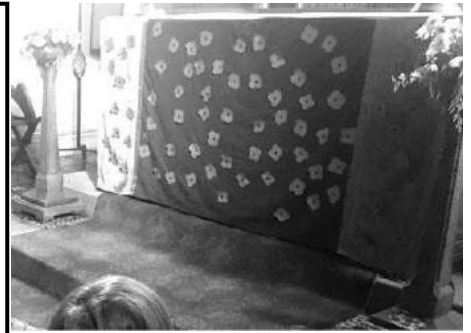
Remembrance Day

'The Uncharted Journey, Eddie, Dementia and Me' is an incredible work. Written by Jackie Huck, published by 2QT, it tells of her husband Eddie's vascular dementia and their journey together into a new bewildering world. I thought I'd just have a quick look at the first couple of pages, and found myself putting it down at page 50 to go and make my evening meal. I then just couldn't put it down; it is intense, raw, powerful, incredibly moving and incredibly honest. Jackie takes us along with her as Eddie's confusion increases and their lives change for ever; you feel more and more for them as the struggle to live a 'normal' life and cope with the problems increases. The 'let's get through the daylight', 'let's get through the darkness' and living hour by hour reducing to living purely in the moment was very recognisable to me (my husband had terminal cancer) but Jackie's story was harder than mine as Eddie drifted away from her before his body gave up. It made me realise that I wasn't alone in that 'living in the moment' reality; I'd always found that hard to explain to people. Jackie expresses it wonderfully.

The fact that all proceeds from the book are being donated to Dementia UK and are specifically towards the funding of an Admiral Nurse for Cumbria is a moving tribute to the love and life that Eddie and Jackie shared together.

Notes from the Herald, December, 1919

Stormy first week then usual weather. Christmas was a Thursday. No coal to be had since early December. Foot and Mouth now at Great Lumley, Co. Durham. A measles epidemic (120 cases) in Appleby and upstream; the carrier came from Durham. No cheap Christmas fares on the railways but at least there are more trains now.

Orton's Vicar took the proposed War Memorial designs to Carlisle for Chancellor Prescott's inspection and (we hope) Faculty. The Chancellor quibbled as usual – "What a tasteless design! Is this all you could think of? It looks like a tea-caddy!" but granted the Faculty in the end.

150 years ago Died at Orton on Christmas Day, 1869, the Rev. J. Whinfield, aged 90, "an eminent classical" scholar and an excellent geographer. He was living in Orton by 1851, see Mannix's 1851 Directory of Westmorland.

Tebay's Joseph Hall, farmer, Town Head, Longdale, sued John Ashton, farmer, Hawes, for £42.19s.7d (now £3,450) for calving cow sold him at Appleby Mart on 26th June. She did calve but died of it. Bench found for Ashton. Tried at Appleby County Court.

Two men were repairing the underside of the iron bridge carrying the LNWR half a mile south of Tebay Station on 3rd December after dark. The rope gave way and they fell into the Lune. One was rescued by Richard Ellison, a local youth; the other was swept over the rapids and drowned. The night was stormy. The two were James Dirkin (saved) and James Capstick (drowned) who was 37, from Lancaster, back in old job after the War. He leaves a widow. Inquest held; Verdict, Accidental Death.

Tebay Primitive Methodist's annual Missionary Meetings, first week of December, were at Tebay, on 5th and Greenholme on 8th.

Six long-service railwaymen from Tebay retired this month (long report on Saturday, 13th, page 7). A former Station Master of Tebay, promoted to same at Penrith for eight years, has died, now Chief Clerk in the Traffic Superintendent's office, Castle Station, Lancaster. He was Mr. G.E. Scott, aged 58; he came from a railway family and began on them aged 14. He lived near Morecambe by 1919.

Fawcett was elected Junior Steward of the Kirkby Stephen and Appleby Wesleyan Circuit at its meeting this month. 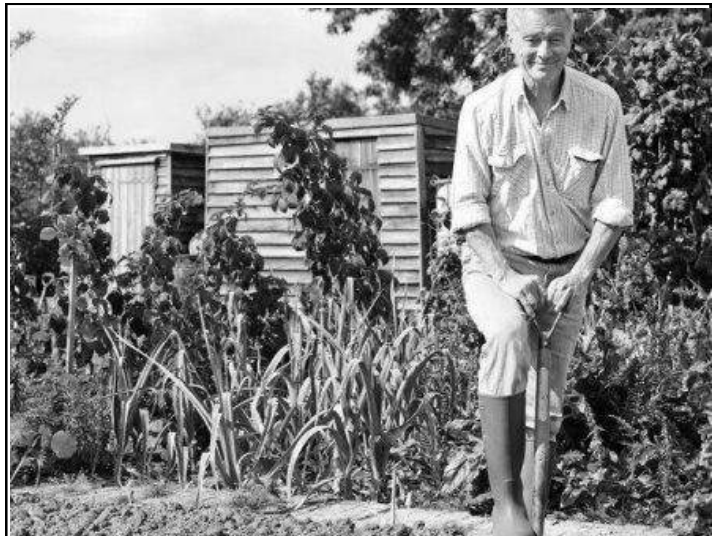

Friends of the 106 Bus

Dear Friend

It has been nearly a year since our last newsletter so I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the current status of the 106 bus service. In the first nine months of 2019 the service carried over 5000 passengers from villages and hamlets along the route, many of whom rely on the bus as a lifeline to get to services and shops as well as providing an opportunity to get out and about to socialise with friends and family.

Earlier this year we welcomed our new secretary, James Levens from Shap Wells Hotel. Our previous secretary, Libby Bateman, is working alongside James as he finds his feet. We thank James for stepping forward to help us keep this route running for the benefit of all.

The 106 bus service costs around £8,000 per year in subsidies to keep running. This money is raised through donations from parish councils, along with grant awards from various bodies and

membership of our Friends Of 106 Bus which invites donations of £15/ year to help keep the route running. Our Friends Of membership is due for renewal for 2019, please find a copy of the renewal form on the reverse of this newsletter and please do support us if you feel the service is of value to your community.

Looking forward to 2020 and beyond, our current contract with Stagecoach expires in June so we will shortly be undertaking a procurement exercise to invite tenders for the contract from 2020–2022. We currently have just over £11,000 in our bank account which will see us through the next 12 months but we will need to continue with our fundraising to ensure the contract is sustainable from 2021–2022. Hopefully we will then be looking to extend for a further 2 years, depending on demand and support from the parishes served by the route. Please let your parish council know how the bus benefits you so it is encouraged to continue with its support.

Please do get in touch with us if you are able to help in anyway with

our fundraising. Perhaps you could hold a coffee morning in your village hall, or a quiz night in your local pub. This service is run by the community for the community, our committee and trustees work on a voluntary basis to keep a professional bus company serving this route. Please help out if you can to enable us to maintain this route for the benefit of everybody into the future.

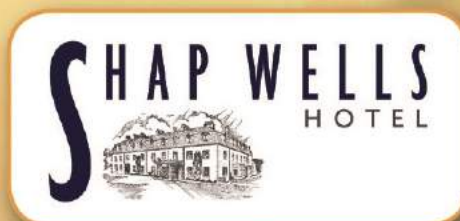

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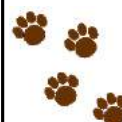
