CHURCH LETTER

From the Revd. Christopher Jenkin

Believing and not believing

A reporter with a clipboard and a microphone was doing a survey in the street – what they call a “Vox Pop”.

“Do you believe in God?” she was asking people. Some replied firmly, “No!” Others were not sure. But when one man answered, “Yes!” the reporter asked, “Does it make any difference to the way you live?” The man shrugged and admitted, “No!”

I think that that kind of “belief” or “faith” – that makes no difference to your daily life – isn’t worth a lot. Of course, it depends *what* you believe about God. If he is, to you, just some vague “force” out beyond the galaxies, then, well, no – this would not make much difference. But if God is as the New Testament describes him – the God that Jesus Christ called “Father” – then if I believe he is real, and there with me at all times, and that one day I will meet him face to face.... Then, wow! This faith will profoundly affect my daily living.

That’s the faith I claim to have. Well, most of the time. Sometimes it gets a bit wobbly! But mostly I feel pretty certain that God is real, and is the most important factor in my life.

How does it affect my daily life? First, my system of ethics – my sense of right and wrong. There’s no way I can casually tell lies, or steal things, or cheat, if I am living my life before him. Second, my attitude to people. Now this I am not so good at! I know I should “love my neighbour as myself”, but honestly, some people are not easy to love, are they? I get irritated with people, and find myself thinking critical thoughts – and sometimes, I fear, saying critical words! This is work in progress.

But what about the hard times? The hurts, the disappointments, the worries? I believe that God knows all about them, and that he watches me with love. He does not guarantee a

trouble-free life; he never promised that things would be easy. But he does promise that in the hardest and darkest times, he is there beside me. As the verse from Psalm 23 says, “Though I pass through the valley of the shadow of death, you are with me!”

Suppose I have really difficult decisions to make, and I honestly do not know what to do! How does my faith help then? I pray for guidance! I ask my God to show me the way. I don’t expect an angelic voice from heaven, or a shimmering signpost – but I ask him to make me sensitive to his leading. It may come through some helpful words from a friend, or through circumstances opening or closing a door. Quite often I find he guides me through the words of the Bible – I could tell you some stories about that! And sometimes I just ask that he helps me to make a wise decision, and not a foolish one, using the intelligence he has given me.

And at the end of the journey? I’m nearly 83. I don’t know how much longer I’ve got, but the final lap must be nearer than it was. But if I trust him; if I believe that Jesus died on the cross so that I might be forgiven; if I believe his promise, “That where I am, you will be also!” (*John 14:3*), then there is nothing to be afraid of. The process of dying may be painful and unpleasant; but to die – as Paul wrote – “is to depart and be with Christ, which is far better!” (*Philippians 1:23*) Far better than even the most wonderful things of this life.

Yes, as I say, my faith sometimes is shaky; and very often I do not live up to my principles, and I have to say “Sorry!” and ask his forgiveness. But ever since I said to Jesus, 62 years ago, “Come into my life as my Lord and friend!” this is what it has meant to me.

Recently, I have been re-reading the 'Letters from America' by Alistair Cooke which I listened to every week for many years. Abridged Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 24th June 2019

1. **PRESENT:** 12 members, with one apology.
2. **Minutes:** The Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on 29th April 2019, were agreed and signed.
3. **Matters Arising:**
 - a. (Item 10b) Knott Lane resurfacing after burial of electric cables: the Chairman has received a Wayleave Agreement from Electricity North West, which would be circulated to all members.
 - b. (Item 7) The 10-year High Stewardship tenancy agreement should have a 5-year break clause.
4. **Treasurer's report:** the Community Account was £5,229.53 and the Premium Account was £8,749.10. £275 has been paid for the new handrails at the steps at West End.
5. **Any Other Business:**
 - a. It was agreed to make a £20 donation towards the forthcoming Families Together Sports Day.
 - b. Rents: since these have not been reviewed for many years, the matter would be raised at the AGM.
6. **Date of AGM:** Monday 2nd September
7. **Date of next Committee Meeting:** Monday 4th November.

ORTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on 17th June and the following issues were discussed:-

1. Concerns were expressed about the spread of ash die-back disease and it was agreed to invite a speaker on this topic to the meeting of the Council to be held in September.
2. It was noted that volunteers were still required to support the Speedwatch traffic calming initiative.
3. A planning application relating to the barn adjacent to Petty Hall, Orton was considered. This proposed development would involve the conversion of the barn to two dwellings and the erection of one further "new build" dwelling. Redundant farm buildings would be removed. The application was generally supported with concerns being raised as to vehicle parking as it was thought undesirable to have cars parked outside the front of the barn (a listed building) or in the road on the corner outside the pub. Full details of the proposal are available on the Yorkshire Dales Planning Authority website under the Planning Section (application E/11/16).
4. It was agreed to again make a financial contribution to the running of the local 106 bus service.

Your local police warn against Doorstep Callers

What is doorstep crime?

Doorstep crime involves cold callers and rogue traders trying to sell goods or services. Experience has shown that work undertaken by doorstep sellers is often of a poor quality and is overpriced. The traders involved prove difficult to trace and as a consequence consumers have difficulties obtaining recompense in respect of any defective work. Due to the nature of these crimes Cumbria Trading Standards treat this work as a priority and work with partner agencies such as Cumbria Police to help raise awareness and tackle potential offenders.

Red light Warning indicators of doorstep crime:

- Person/Business cold calling at various properties touting for business
- No paperwork is given and there are no cancellation rights
- Money is requested 'up front' before any work has been carried out
- Trader does not complete the work and consumer cannot contact them

Report an incident

If you or someone you know requires assistance in dealing with a rogue trader you can contact Trading

Standards via the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 03454 04 05 06. If your case requires urgent assistance they will refer your details immediately to Cumbria Trading Standards or alternatively you can contact Cumbria Police on 101.

FARM WATCH

On Tuesday 6th August, Operation Farmwatch took place in Cumbria. Police officers and PCSO's from the Eden Neighbourhood policing team worked alongside local farmers who volunteered to take part.

The farmers' support is critical to the success of these Operations which play an important part in tackling rural acquisitive crime. It is recognised that farming is a demanding way of life and the fact that they give up their time to work with us is really appreciated. These operations also provide a brilliant opportunity to gain intelligence regarding people in our area to form part of a bigger picture.

Vehicles were stop checked in order to detect and disrupt any criminal activity. In Upper Eden three males out lamping and trespassing on farm land were disrupted and sent back over the county border. Rural crime has a huge impact on our communities and we will continue to do more of these Operations.

A Degree Sixty-Six Years Late!

John Falshaw who was head teacher of Orton Church of England Primary School from 1963 until his retirement in 1989, has lived in the village in the attractive little house called Shallowford ever since.

He was trained at St. John's College, York (a teacher-training college for men only, part of the University of Leeds). But in those days, what he received on 1st August 1953 was only a "Certificate In Education".

After working in three different schools in Yorkshire (during which time he met and married his wife, Margaret), he moved to Orton to become the head teacher in the brand new school building – the school had moved from the old building in the middle of the village (now the Chocolate Factory) in February, when Mrs Evelyn Cox was head teacher; the move happened during the coldest winter for many years, and much of the school's equipment was transferred to the new building by sledge!

Then in the autumn of 2018, John, now 88, was excited to receive a letter from York St. John University to say that all the students from his old college, and also from Ripon College (which took women students), were to be awarded an Honorary Degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.Hon) at three conferment ceremonies in June 2019 at the York St. John Campus. This would involve over 1,500 old students from the two colleges.

John's first reaction was to be delighted, of course, but to fear that because of his deteriorating health there was no way he would be able to attend one of these ceremonies in person, and would have to be satisfied with receiving the certificate by post. However his two sons, Howard and Chris, insisted that they would get him there!

So on Wednesday 26th June John and Chris were present at the splendid ceremony in the Temple Hall which started at 11 a.m. The assembled company was greeted by Vice Chancellor Professor Karen Stanton. The able-bodied were invited to come forward to receive their certificate, but even those in wheelchairs like John were individually applauded when their name was read out. After collecting their certificates in the foyer, everyone moved to the Marquee for Afternoon Tea.

Asked what was the highlight of the day for him, John paused and responded, "It was all a highlight! There was deep satisfaction that I was able to go. The only disappointment was that I was the only student from my year, and I only recognised three other students!"

Notes from the Herald, August and September 1919

August: Drought. Bank Holiday weekend (1st – 3rd) was wet. The Glorious 12th was hot. Rationing continues for butter, meat, sugar (Ravenstonedale claimed the most for jam), and milk price to be fixed by the Kirkby Stephen Food Control Committee.

Orton The R.D.C.'s removed 100 loads of mud, rubbish, etc. from the Orton Town End watercourse. Its upper end (privately owned) is still clogged. Four houses near the Park have no water, the R.D.C. heard. Roads are dusty now due to the weather.

Tebay Station's workforce includes four youths aged 15 – 17, up for catapulting – 3 fined £1 (now £8) each and costs; the 4th acquitted.

To let: Coatflatt Hall, house and 111 acres.

Ravenstonedale's springs in Green Bell Bottom may be the answer for the waterless in Smardale, Waitby etc as far as Musgrave. The R.D.C. is now seeing if they could be piped. The spring in Smardale Gill was the first choice but rejected as it would need to build a reservoir on the fell there.

September: Wet start then mostly fine; storms 12th then fine and frosty. New ration cards needed from 13th October for butter, meat and sugar, so register for yours by 30th September at your usual shops.

Orton: Leonard Coates (Selside) road-foreman, was working in Dalt's Quarry on the road to Shap and Kendal on Monday morning, 1st September, when stones fell from above killing him instantly. The quarry is Westmorland County Council's for roadstone to patch the local roads. Orton Parochial Committee (part of the R.D.C.) says that Orton Village has enough water, but Park, New House and Field Head do not.

Auction of Intake Farm, Gaisgill, 18 cattle, 95 sheep, furniture including a 1689 oak bedding chest – Thursday 18th, 1pm for Mrs. Thornton.

To let: farms at Gaisgill, house and 44 acres and rights on Tebay Fell, entry 25th March for Edward Beck, Gaisgill; another farm at Gaisgill, being the 47 acres called Long Gills in Orton and Tebay with rights on Longdale Fell and Tebay Fell occupied by Mr. W. Barton and part of the heafed sheep at valuation. Closes 29th. To let: Orton, Bridge End Farm, house and 72 acres plus 65 acres Allotment. Apply to Thomas Atkinson, Daw Bank, Tebay. To let on the Stobars Hall Estate (Kirkby Stephen) the two farms in Longdale, Orton, called High and Low Flakebridge, total 167 acres the two, and heafed flock at valuation – G.E. Thompson, Stobars Hall.

Tebay Auction at Cross Keys Inn on Friday, 12th, 4pm, the farm Waskew Head, house and sixty eight and a half acres. It failed to sell on 12th as top bid was only £600. Tebay Flower Show and Gala,

Saturday, 6th in the Endowed School had over 450 exhibits. Proceeds for Tebay Church War Memorial Fund. Tebay Primitive Methodist Church Harvest on Sunday, 28th had special hymns sung by choir.

To let, Cotegill, Tebay, house and 80 acres and rights on Longdale Common; present tenant is Mr. T. Morphet.

Ravenstonedale's Mr. Albert Thexton, born there, educated at Sedbergh School till move to Fell End School, as Master, aged 17, and trained while there to be teacher (Glasgow course) thence 42 years teaching in Greenock; has now retired at Greenock. Was elected F.E.I.S. (Fellow of the Educational Institute of Scotland) in 1890. He took his holidays in Ravenstonedale sometimes. He is the brother of Mrs. Fawcett, West View, Ravenstonedale and is the youngest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. Thexton, High Sprint Gill, Fell End – Report and photo of him p.10 on 13th.

On Saturday 27th, a national Rail Strike begins. Ravenstonedale Church Harvest on Friday and Sunday, 26th and 28th.

An Oxford clergyman standing in for the Vicar (not in Westmorland) began the B.C.P. prayer for rain. The parish clerk, sitting nearby, tugged his sleeve and said "No, Sir, no". Clergyman – "Why not? It will help the harvest". Clerk – "Sir, the visitors are our harvest. Rain will stop them coming!"

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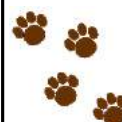
